

• to gather sea urchins from 16 April to 30 november in the department of Var

- to capture or hunt octopus from 1
 June to 30 September
 to fish or hunt in the zones
- reserved for swimming, including the underwater trails



Description of the site of natural interest

The trail is located on the Domaine du Rayol in the heart of the Maures corniche and opposite Port Cros National Park. Well sheltered from wind, the cove offers a wide diversity of habitats. Numerous biotopes are present here: rocky talus, overhangs, caves, sandy beds, seagrass meadows, all in depths of less than 4 metres.


